Biographical Note

James Quinn Wilson (1931–2012) was born in Denver, Colorado, on 27 May 1931. The only child of Claude Wilson, a salesman, and Marie Quinn Wilson, a homemaker, he was raised in Long Beach, California, and attended Jordan High School. Wilson received a bachelor's degree in political science (summa cum laude) from the University of Redlands in 1952. He served in the United States Navy from 1952 to 1955 before pursuing graduate work in political science at the University of Chicago, where he received a master's in 1957 and doctorate in 1959, both from the department of political science. His doctoral dissertation was an analysis of the political behavior of African Americans in Chicago during the 1950s and was the basis for his first book, *Negro Politics: The Search for Leadership* (1960).

Wilson was a faculty member of the Harvard University Department of Government from 1961 to 1987. He was appointed Henry Lee Shattuck Professor of Government in 1972 and served as chairman of the department from 1969 to 1973. He was also director of the Joint Center for Urban Studies of Massachusetts Institute of Technology (MIT) and Harvard from 1963 to 1966.

From 1987 to 1997, he was James A. Collins Professor of Management and Public Policy at the Anderson School of Management at the University of California, Los Angeles (UCLA). From 1998 to 2009, he was Ronald Reagan Professor of Public Policy at Pepperdine University. From 2009 until his death, he was a Distinguished Scholar in the Department of Political Science and Senior Fellow at the Clough Center for the Study of Constitutional Democracy at Boston College.

Wilson was a prolific author of essays and book reviews and authored or coauthored 16 books, including *City Politics* (1963, with Edward C. Banfield), *The Amateur Democrat* (1966), *Varieties of Police Behavior* (1968), *Political Organizations* (1973), *Thinking about Crime* (1975), *The Politics of Regulation* (1980), *Bureaucracy* (1989), *The Moral Sense* (1993), *The Marriage Problem* (2002), and *Understanding America* (2008, with Peter H. Schuck). Wilson's *American Government: Institutions and Policies* (with John J. Dilulio, Jr.) has gone through 13 editions and is one of the most widely used textbooks on American government and politics.

Wilson chaired the White House Task Force on Crime in 1966 and the 1972–73 National Advisory Commission on Drug Abuse Prevention. He was a member of the Attorney General's Task Force on Violent Crime in 1981, the President's Foreign Intelligence Advisory Board from 1985 to 1990, and the President's Council on Bioethics from 2002 to 2005. He served on the boards of the New England Electric System, Protection One, State Farm Mutual Insurance, the RAND Corporation, and the Pardee RAND Graduate School. He chaired the Council of Academic Advisors of the American Enterprise Institute (AEI).

He received numerous awards from the American Political Science Association (APSA), including the James Madison Award for distinguished scholarly contribution to political science in 1990 and the John Gaus Award for "exemplary scholarship in the joint tradition of political science and public administration" in 1994. From 1991 to 1992, he served as APSA's president, for which he earned a Distinguished Service Certificate. In 2003, Wilson was awarded the Presidential Medal of Freedom, the nation's highest civilian award. In 2007, he received the Bradley Prize from the Lynde and Harry Bradley Foundation. He was awarded honorary degrees from seven universities, including Harvard.

He married Roberta Evans in New Haven, Connecticut, on 13 September 1952; they had two children, Matthew Wilson (born in 1960) and Annie Wilson Gilbert (born in 1964).

Wilson died at the age of 80 on 2 March 2012 in Boston, Massachusetts, from complications of leukemia.

Wilson's library of books, many annotated, and his personal computer are in the Wilson Collection and located in the archives. His personal computer, containing correspondence, drafts of publications, and photographs, is unprocessed.

Christopher H. Foreman, Jr., a student of Wilson, donated five pieces of correspondence he maintained with Wilson, two published articles by Wilson, a program to the Gold Honor Medal Awards of The National Institute of Social Sciences with a related letter of correspondence attached, and a copy of his book, *Signals From the Hill: Congressional Oversight and the Challenge of Social Regulation*, published by Yale University Press in 1988. These items have been integrated into the collection and are noted in brackets.

Scope and Content Note

The James Q. Wilson Papers, 1940–2012 (43 boxes) document the career of Wilson as a political science professor at Harvard University, University of California-Los Angeles (UCLA), and Pepperdine University; his speeches, research, and writing; and his advisory roles, personal, and professional relationships. Effort was made to maintain the original order in which the collection arrived at Pardee RAND Graduate School and the arrangement reflects Wilson's organization of materials largely by subject, project, correspondent, or institution. The collection is divided into seven series: Consulting Files, Personal Files, Publications and Writings, Research Files, Speeches and Lectures, Teaching/University Affiliation Files, and Oversize. The bulk of collection materials date from the 1960s to 2012 and consists of advertisements, agreements, annual reports, awards and degrees, by-laws, charts and graphs, clippings, course materials, correspondence, meeting agendas and minutes, membership lists, memoranda, notes, organization charts, papers, presentation materials, programs, publications, reports, speeches and lectures, receipts, reprints, syllabi, and writings. As the collection is arranged by both subject and format of the materials, researchers should be aware that materials—especially correspondence, lectures, and research materials—are dispersed through the series. Correspondence is divided into incoming, outgoing, and outgoing and incoming, and arranged alphabetically by correspondent; individuals are represented in only one category within a series. The item count indicates pieces of correspondence, not including attachments. Newspaper clippings were replaced with photocopies; originals are stored separately.

Arranged alphabetically by organization, institution, or topic, the series consists of agendas, clippings, correspondence, meeting materials, membership lists, organization charts, memoranda, notes, presentation materials, reports, and writings that document Wilson's extensive consulting experience with the corporate and private sectors, and government industries.

Significant subseries include materials that document Wilson's work with the American Enterprise Institute (AEI); the Criminal Justice Legal Foundation (CJLF); a California Firearms Case, a Los Angeles Firearms Study, and the National Academy of Sciences' (NAS) Committee to Improve Research Information and Data on Firearms. Wilson's work with the National Research Council's (NRC's) Committee on Law and Justice (CLAJ), Committee on Deterrence and the Death Penalty; Public/Private Ventures, Partnership for Research on Religion and At-Risk Youth (PRRAY); Pardee RAND Graduate School, Board of Governors; Randolph Foundation, Board of Directors; Federal Bureau of Investigation (FBI), Director's Advisory Board; and the United States President's Council on Bioethics. The subseries are numerous and diverse, yet do not represent the vast extent of Wilson's work throughout his career.

Series 2: Personal Files, 1965-2012, n.d., Boxes 8-10 (3)

Arranged alphabetically by subject and material type, the series consists of agreements, awards and degrees, correspondence, ephemera, lists, a map, photographs, programs, a speech, receipts, reports, and writings that document Wilson's personal interests and relationships.

Correspondence is the bulk of the series and a significant part of the collection. Correspondents are diverse and include individuals in the civil service and private sectors, colleagues, students,

clubs, and private citizens. Correspondents are numerous; however, the number of correspondence for each is usually less than five pieces; the significant exception is Peter B. Clark with 42 pieces.

Photographs document Wilson's personal life and professional career. The Bohemian Club and Wilson's membership is also documented in the series.

Arranged alphabetically by material type and publication or title within, the series consists of advertisements, agreements and contracts, clippings, and correspondence related to Wilson's publications. The bulk of the series consists of clippings and reprints of articles in academic journals, popular magazines, newspapers, and newsletters.

The Correspondence subseries is a significant portion of the series. Correspondents are diverse and numerous; however, most individuals are represented by one or two pieces of correspondence, frequently letters of comment.

The Drafts and Miscellaneous subseries contains both Wilson's published and unpublished drafts; unpublished titles include, "Black Politics in American Cities," "Homosexual Marriages," and "Student Discipline In a Private University."

Series 4: Speeches and Lectures, 1964-1965, 1969, 1971-1974, 1976, 1979-1983, 1985, 1987-2002, 2011-2012, n.d., Boxes 17-19 (3)

Arranged by format of material (outlines and transcripts, and reprints) and chronologically within, the series contains drafts, clippings, correspondence, and reprints that document Wilson's extensive public speaking on a wide range of topics to varied audiences, including private and professional organizations, and university students. Topics include public policy, "Broken Windows," crime, democracy, genes, morality, marriage, police, war, and terrorism. Unidentified transcripts are similar to drafts for possible publication. Course lectures are also located within the Teaching/University Affiliation Files series.

Series 5: Research Files, 1949, 1951, 1956-1959, 1961-1966, 1968-1977, 1979-1983, 1985-2012, n.d., Boxes 20-33 (14)

Composed of Wilson's subject files and arranged alphabetically, the series contains agendas, charts and graphs, clippings, correspondence, memoranda, notes, reports, papers and writings, presentation materials, and syllabi. Representing Wilson's diverse interests and areas of study, the series contains materials related to his publications, teaching, and personal interests. Similar subject files and related materials are located in the Publications and Writings and Teaching/University Affiliation Files series. Wilson's folder titles have been maintained with changes and additions noted in brackets.

Arranged alphabetically by institution and material type within, the series is composed of agendas, agreements, annual reports, by-laws, charts and graphs, clippings, correspondence, examinations, lecture outlines, minutes, membership lists, notes, papers, presentation materials, reports, syllabi, and writings that document Wilson's teaching and advisory roles on boards at Boston College, Claremont McKenna College, George Mason University, Harvard University, Stanford University, University of California-Los Angeles (UCLA), Pepperdine University, and University of Virginia. Course lectures and records related to the Working Group on Critical Junctures in American Government and Politics at the Hoover Institution, Stanford University, from 2009 to 2011 are well represented in the series.
