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### **Social, Urban, Rural and Resilience Global Practice (SURR) at The World Bank** (March 2020 – Present)

- Baseline assessment of a Community Driven Development (CDD) initiative in Papua New Guinea, in cooperation with DFAT and the Government of PNG.
- Developed a quasi-experimental, multi-level evaluation design utilizing Propensity Score Matching (PSM) and Difference-in-Differences (DID) methodology. Designed and utilized the PSM model to report baseline conditions; utilized OLS regressions to validate the use of difference-in-differences and power calculations to validate sample size and minimum detectable effect.

Performed a systematic literature review of school dropout with particular attention to learning as an underlying factor. Lead author for forthcoming publication.
